Wrapped in the swag that lay beside it, the body was buried 60 yards from the 49-Mile Well and a rough railing placed round it. Constable AJ Jones of Halls Creek, accompanied by a young man named Samuel Hazlett arrived at No 49 Well on June 20. It was surrounded by low ti-tree scrub and spinifex, with a sandhill on the north and south sides. Rain had recently fallen, obliterating most of the cattle and horse tracks. About 20 feet from the south-west corner of the railing round the well the constable saw a heap of bushes and about eight feet to the north were remnants of an old camp fire. Upon removing the bushes, he found a swag, a military coat, a travelling rug and a bush rug folded partly under and over the body of a man, which Hazlett identified as that of Jack Smith. His body was too decomposed for the constable to be able to observe any bruises. On searching the clothes of deceased, the constable found a bank book showing a credit of £1. 4s 2d and a Yale key, while in the trousers was a wallet containing a cheque for £15 made payable to J Smith or bearer. There were also a £1 note and 5/6 in silver. Nothing definite was known as to whether there were any next of kin, but it was thought that deceased may have a relative at Bunbury, and might be the owner of some land around there. He was known by Mr McCallum of the Newcastle Club Hotel in Fremantle, who believed that Smith was not married.
250	Well 49 Canning Stock Route	Jack	Smith	27-05-1939	Prospector Samuel Hazlett, who was with Smith when he passed away, told the police of how Smith, after being injured, remarked that he thought he would be alright, but later began to show the effects of the mishap. At No 46 Well a man named George Lannigan, handling Billiluna bullocks, engaged Frank Duggan in Smith's place, but Smith travelled through with the bullocks as far as No 42 Well. He was complaining of a pain in his right side, but thought he would recover; he also seemed to have a sore back and at times crawled instead of walking. From No 47 Well he seemed to get gradually worse. At No 42 Well Hazlett made arrangements with Lannigan about taking Smith back to Billiluna Station. On the 16\ Hazlett left No 42 Well with Smith in order to accompany him to Billiluna. They finally came to No 49 Well about 9 o'clock at night. Smith was then in a bad way and though Hazlett did all he could for him, he died at 4pm on the 27th. Hazlett covered the body with Smith's swag, placed the bushes on top of it, and subsequently sent a native with a letter concerning the death to Mr Falconer, owner of Billiluna. Jack became a well-known Kimberley artist and his paintings portray a unique first hand pictorial account of a largely unknown and unrepeatable chapter of Australian history. One of his paintings was dedicated to Howard Coate (Pioneer, Missionary, Linguist and Nurse in the Kimberley region. Relative of the authors) and the 'value-added' story read "The old time Blackfellas looked out for him. They would not kill Mr Coate, even if they would kill other Whitefellas. The old people taught us to have a lot of respect for Mr Coate. Traditional people had great respect for the way that Mr Coate lived in the bush with them. He however, at the request of the management, agreed to work another shift, and should in the ordinary course, have gone to work at 2 o'clock, the usual hour, and ceased at 10 pm. For some reason he was unable to commence until two hours later, when his attention was drawn to the fretting of the ground by some Italians. Smith continued working and at 11 pm about two hundred tons of earth fell away. Smith was killed, also a horse drawing the trucks and a dog. Had Smith been able to commence work at the usual time, he would have knocked off an hour prior to the accident. It was thought the fall was due to the recent heavy rains percolating the ground." So at the inquest the jury returned a verdict of accidental death, no blame being attached to any person.
